

# **CONNECT THE QUAYS**

The City is committed to enhancing the quality of life of residents and taxpayers by creating a vibrant waterfront community. To support this vision, the City is exploring options to connect Victoria Quay on the Somass River in north Port Alberni to Harbour Quay on the Alberni Harbour in south Port Alberni with a multi-use pathway.

Through the City's 2019 – 2023 Corporate Strategic Plan, Council has identified five strategic priorities, one of which is to foster a community that is safe, healthy and inclusive. To support this, the City is developing "Connect the Quays," a project which aims to link Victoria Quay and Harbour Quay with a multi-use pathway.

City staff are currently working on a conceptual design to better understand the opportunities and constraints of the project in relation to land use and ownership, environmental impacts, engineering options, funding opportunities and budget implications.

If constructed, this project will:

- create nodes where the community can recognize and celebrate local Indigenous culture and history;
- offer looping connections to existing and planned City trail systems;
- connect citizens and neighbourhoods;
- encourage recreational activity and non-motorized communiting; and
- highlight the City's waterfront and its many uses, past and present.

The City is activley looking for innovative funding opportunities. At the August 10th Council Meeting, Council directed City staff to prepare applications for two Investing in Canada Infrastructure government grants:

- 1. Community Culture and Recreation Infrastructure
- 2. Rural and Northern Communitites Infrastructure

The City of Port Alberni is committed to working closely with First Nations and the community throughout the project.

As part of our commitment, the City will:

- consult and engage with the public as the project develops and pathway design takes place; and
- provide regular project updates via newsletters, fact sheets and web updates.

The City supported the Port Alberni Port Authority in the opening of Port Alberni's new Food Hub to its seafood processors. ## **RESIDENTIAL YARDWASTE** CURBSIDE PICKUP

Help make the Alberni Valley a Wildfire Resilient Community by starting your FireSmart journey today. By removing flammable debris on your property, you can help protect your home and neighbourhood in the event of a wildfire.

The Alberni Valley Emergency Program is offering free residential yardwaste curbside pickup. This program is grant funded through the Union of BC Municipalities and is targeted towards residents in the valley who cannot transport yardwaste to a disposal location themselves.

A reminder that residents are responsible for the pruning, trimming, care and maintenance of trees on their property. This is especially important for trees that are located adjacent to streets, sidewalks, and alleways.

While pruning a tree can have many benefits, the most important is keeping the people around it safe. Removing dangerous imbs and maintaining a safe tree is always the best course of action.

### YES

- Small trees, branches (maximum 4 inches in diameter)
- Two piles per property Piles neatly stacked at roadside with butt ends facing the same direction Max pile size (8ft. x 8ft. x 5ft. high)

#### NO

- Construction debris, garbage, organics
  Invasive species (including blackberry vines), grass clippings, leaves, soft plant material
  Piles with gravel, dirt, or root covered with dirt
