2016 City Budget: Your Priorities. Your City

In April, City Council approved the 2016-2020 Financial Plan. The City's financial plan is a budget that describes how much money the City will raise and spend within each of the next five years. The plan provides for the many services that keep the community safe and livable, encourage business growth and investments, and make Port Alberni an attractive destination for visitors.


The financial plan aligns with City Council's Strategic Plan and was developed with considerable public input received through letters and emails, an online survey, and a public budget meeting in February. The Financial Plan includes \$28 million in operating budget and \$2.3 million in capital for 2016. The operating budget covers dayto-day spending on services such as recreation programs, parks maintenance, public transit, fire protection and police. The capital budget funds the construction and repair of City assets that support municipal services such as public roads and bridges, buildings and community centres, and other major equipment.

The Financial Plan for 2016 reflects an overall budget increase of \$549,010 or 2%. Most residents will see a modest increase of about 2.7% over last year, which, for the average household, works out to about \$47.

Highlights of the 2016 Financial Plan include:

- New recreation management software that will include online registration and improved access to program and event information
- Development of a comprehensive design and plan for the Johnston Road streetscape
- Further improvements to Canal Beach & other City facilities
- Increased external marketing efforts to promote Port Alberni and our interests
- Additional support for youth recreation programs
- Installation of bike lanes along major corridors
- Replacement and renewal of critical infrastructure




Help Us Read Your Water Meter Quickly and Safely

Did you know that before utility bills are sent out, our staff goes to each property throughout the community to collect water consumption readings. That's over 6,500 properties visited over the course of a few weeks!

In order to collect these readings quickly and safely it's important that we have easy access to your water meter. If we can't take an initial reading, we have to come back for an additional inspection which takes extra time and resources.

Please ensure that the area around your meter is clear. Don't place obstructions such as cars, trailers, sheds, shrubs, boxes etc around or over the meter. This allows for a timely and efficient collection and ultimately helps keep system costs down for everyone.

Your water meter will either be a wall mounted "puck" style or an in-ground meter located on your property. Find yours and consider ways to make it more accessible.
